A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTERS BETWEEN THIS BOARD AND THE CITY OF GREEN

WHEREAS, at an election held on May 3, 2022, on the question of issuing bonds of the School District in the aggregate principal amount of \$67,845,000 for the purpose of constructing, adding to, renovating, remodeling, furnishing, equipping and otherwise improving school district buildings and facilities and clearing, improving and equipping their sites and of levying taxes outside the ten-mill limitation to pay the debt charges on those bonds and any anticipatory securities, the requisite majority of those voting on the question voted in favor of it; and

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2022, pursuant to that voter approval, the School District issued its \$67,845,000 School Improvement Bonds, Series 2022, issued on November 9, 2022 (the Bonds); and

WHEREAS, this Board is participating in the School Building Assistance Expedited Local Partnership Program (ELPP), pursuant to which it has and will apply local resources to achieve separate and distinct parts of an overall master plan of School District facility needs prepared in conjunction with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (the Commission); and

WHEREAS, this Board has previously entered into an agreement (the Original ELPP Project Agreement) with the Commission, and in 2022 entered into an Expedited Local Partnership Program Second Amended and Restated Project Agreement (the Second Amendment to ELPP Agreement, and together with the Original ELPP Project Agreement as previously amended, the ELPP Project Agreement) with the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment contemplates (i) construction of a new Elementary School to house grades 2 through 5, (ii) construction of a new Middle School to house grades 6 through 8 and (iii) allowance to abate and demolish Greenwood Early Learning Center, Green Intermediate School and Green Middle School (collectively, the Commission Project); and

WHEREAS, the costs of the Commission Project, together with other facilities improvements to be undertaken by the School District (collectively, the Project), are to be funded from (i) proceeds of the Bonds, (ii) proceeds of the School District's \$37,850,000 Certificates of Participation, Series 2022, issued on November 9, 2022 (the COPs), and (iii) City Funds, as defined and described below, subject to later reimbursement to the School District by the Commission of a portion of the costs of the Commission Project upon the meeting of certain conditions (ELPP Credit); and

WHEREAS, a portion of the Project includes construction of a new Middle School (GMS) to house grades 6 through 8, including a gymnasium (the GMS Gym); and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that a community courts facility (Community Courts Facility) be constructed and incorporated into GMS, in addition to the GMS Gym, providing additional recreational opportunities to City residents and freeing up Bond and COPs proceeds to pay costs of additional classroom facilities not included in the Commission Project; and

WHEREAS, as described in the proposed Cooperative Agreement for Community Learning Centers between this Board and the City (the Cooperative Agreement), the City will provide to the School District the City Funds in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$14,900,000 to pay all or a portion of the costs of constructing the GMS Gym and Community Courts Facility from proceeds of the City Securities or other funds legally available to the City, and using the City Funds, the School District will be responsible for the design and construction of the GMS Gym and Community Courts Facility, and thereafter the Agreement and the Shared Use Agreement (as defined in the Cooperative Agreement) will govern the rights and responsibilities of the parties as to the operation, maintenance and use of the GMS Gym and Community Courts Facility; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 755.16 of the Revised Code, the GMS Gym and the Community Courts Facility will be used for governmental, civic or educational operations or recreational activities or for such other purposes as permitted by law, and as such are "community centers" under Section 755.16 of the Revised Code (Community Learning Centers); and

WHEREAS, this Board and the City recognize that the Community Learning Centers are needed for governmental, civic, educational and recreational purposes of the School District and City and that the sharing of the proposed Community Learning Centers will contribute substantially to fulfilling those needs and the purposes and functions contemplated by Section 755.16 of the Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, this Board and the City have determined that it is necessary and appropriate to coordinate their efforts and to cooperate in the construction, financing, operation, maintenance and use of the Community Learning Centers in order to achieve cost and other efficiencies and to maximize the benefit of the provision of such facilities to all those who work and reside in the District and the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council currently has under consideration Ordinance No. 2023-02, authorizing and approving the form of the definitive Cooperative Agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Board has reviewed that Cooperative Agreement and determined it should be approved;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Green Local School District, County of Summit, Ohio, that:

Section 1. <u>Cooperative Agreement</u>. The President or Vice-President and the Treasurer of this Board are hereby authorized to sign and deliver, in the name and on behalf of the School District, the Cooperative Agreement to be entered into pursuant to Section 755.16 of the Revised Code, providing for cooperation between those parties in the construction, financing, operation, maintenance and use of the Community Learning Centers and other related matters as determined by those officials.

The Cooperative Agreement is approved in substantially the form as are now on file with the Treasurer, together with any changes or amendments that are not inconsistent with this Resolution and not substantially adverse to the School District that are approved by the officers signing those documents on behalf of the School District, all of which shall be conclusively evidenced by the signing of the Cooperative Agreement or amendments thereto by those officers.

- Section 2. Other Actions. The President or Vice-President and the Treasurer of this Board, the Superintendent or other School District officials as shall be designated by those officials, as appropriate, are each authorized and directed to do all things necessary and consistent with this Resolution and to take such actions as are necessary or appropriate to consummate the agreements and transactions contemplated by this Resolution.
- Section 3. <u>Prior Acts Ratified and Confirmed</u>. Any actions previously taken by School District officials or agents of this Board in furtherance of the matters set forth in this Resolution are hereby approved, ratified and confirmed.
- Section 4. <u>Certification and Delivery of Resolution to the City</u>. The Treasurer is authorized and directed to deliver or cause to be delivered a certified copy of this Resolution to the City.
- Section 5. <u>Compliance with Open Meeting Requirements</u>. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board and of any of its committees concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were held, in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.
- **Section 6.** <u>Captions and Headings</u>. The captions and headings in this Resolution are solely for convenience of reference and in no way define, limit or describe the scope or intent of any Sections, subsections, paragraphs, subparagraphs or clauses hereof.
- **Section 7.** <u>Effective Date</u>. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.

The Superintendent and Treasurer recommend the Board of Education approve Campbell the following: Choinacki RESOLUTION TO APPROVE ATTORNEY-CLIENT FEE CONTRACT AND Cohen AUTHORIZE LITIGATION Fanelly WHEREAS, large social media companies have designed their products, services Stovnoff and platforms, and implemented algorithms in their programming, for the intended purpose and effect of addicting children and adolescents to their products, services and Carried/Failed platforms, which have caused a youth mental health crisis and an increase in depression, eating disorders, suicide, and other mental and physical injuries; and To WHEREAS, the conduct of the social medial companies has created a public nuisance in the communities and specifically on school campuses, including in this school district, by targeting their products to adolescents and children, and causing worsening mental health and behavioral disorders including anxiety, depression, disordered eating and cyberbullying; making it more difficult to educate students; and forcing schools to take steps such as hiring additional mental health professionals. developing lesson plans about the effects of social media and providing additional training to teachers; and WHEREAS, the law firms of Peters, Kalail & Markakis Co., LPA and Frantz Law Group, APLC ("Law Firms") have offered to jointly represent the Green Local School District in Summit County, Ohio in a potential mass tort and nuisance action against the social media companies to rectify and compensate schools in Ohio and other States for injuries, harms, and damages caused by their conduct (the "Lawsuit"); and

WHEREAS, the Law Firms have presented an Attorney-Client Fee Contract ("Agreement") to represent the District in the Lawsuit, and a copy of the Agreement has been attached and is fully incorporated herein; and WHEREAS, under the terms of the Agreement, if there is no recovery from the Lawsuit then the District shall not be charged attorneys' fees nor shall the District bear any costs or expenses. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board of Education of the Green Local School District in Summit County, Ohio approves and enters into the Agreement with the Law Firms, and directs the Board President, Superintendent, and Treasurer to execute the Agreement and return the same to the Law Firms; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT it is hereby found and determined that all formal action of the Board of Education concerning and/or relating to the adoption of this Resolution was taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and conducted in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Revised Code; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Board of Education authorizes the Law Firms to file a complaint in the appropriate United States District Court(s) having file a complaint in the appropriate United States District Court(s) having jurisdiction over the Lawsuit; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent, Treasurer and other administrators and staff to provide reasonable assistance to the Law Firms to enable the handling of the Lawsuit.
